<u>Arts and Culture</u>	
Calliope Historical Village Funding toward labor and materials to repair and replace roofs on the stagecoach depot, physician office and merchant store, plus painting/repairing of other buildings to preserve the structures.	\$5,000
<u>Civic and Community</u>	
City of Hawarden Trail is part of a larger project known as the "Heart of Hawarden" Community and Attraction Tourism. Funding toward finishing approx. 1,200 ft. of a one-mile concrete walking trail. End result will be a tree-lined trail. Project will connect nearly all of the City's community attractions and provide a safe alternative to walking along the narrow, high traffic county road.	\$19,000
Hawarden Area Partnership for Progress For downtown area, funds to purchase 30 pre-mounted 3'x5' American flags on wooden poles, and brackets & holders. Project will honor Veterans and promote civic pride by replacing torn/ragged flags.	\$953
Hawarden Community Hospital Auxiliary <i>Fiscal Sponsor is Hawarden Community Hospital.</i> Support toward materials and labor for downtown Thrift Shop windows, front door, and facade repair to increase energy efficiency and improve appearance.	\$7,000
Hawarden Volunteer Fire Department Funds to purchase an air tank filling enclosure for the SCBA (self contained breathing apparatus) tank refill station. Project will eliminate the chance of severe injury or death from rupturing SCBA tanks during refill process.	\$6,250
<u>Education</u>	
Hawarden Public Library Funding for scanning costs of 800 photo negatives and descriptions of Hawarden's history; as well as for a portion of server storage costs. Digitally preserved items will be placed on the library's web site for viewing by the public.	\$1,500
West Sioux-Ireton Daycare/Preschool Center Funds to purchase 12 preschool chairs, 1 storage tray unit, 1 manipulative storage unit, and 1 learning carpet. New Center plans to open in August 2008. Several surveys indicated a strong need for this type of center in the West Sioux Community School District.	\$1,290
<u>Human Services</u>	
Hawarden American Lutheran Church The Community Food Pantry is hosted by the Church. Funds for shelving units, storage bins, and an additional freezer for "Food Pantry" food products. Each month a "food basket" is prepared for 15-20 families, serving at least 80 families during the year.	\$1,750
